Dear Readers, Greetings from Shiksha Sopan

The July month was very energetic for our volunteers as well as for students because new academic session started, Baal Sabha, Pravah Baal Akhbaar, Amar Ujala printing press visit, schools visit of Sopan Ashram and many programes were conducted smoothly.

The brief details of the events are here for you.

### **School Visits at Sopan Ashram**

The schools reopened in July and schools started to visit Sopan Ashram in full swing. This time three institutions were visited and learnt many more things from this place.

30 students from electrical and electronics trade of ITI bilhaur, Kanpur Nagar and their mentors came to visit Sopan Ashram on 22<sup>nd</sup> July, 2024. Mr. Ritesh Singh showed experiments related to the trade, he showed IC and its operations, three-phase connections of motor in a simple way. Mr. Amit Kumar Bajpai also interacted with them and showed simple experiments related to electronics. They visited our labs with Sopan volunteers and see the things that are very simple but more useful.

On another visit on 23rd July, Students from Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya, Sarsaol and Kendriya Vidyala, Chakeri came. This visit was coordinated by Dr. Subhas Seth, PGT, Physics, JNV. First we gave a common session to them, in which we showed simple Physics experiments, the capacitor making with glasses were the most attractive for the students, they also visited our labs. One activity also planned for them was to measure the friction coefficient of given block and a sheet. Students and their teachers were happy with this visit and they want to visit Sopan Ashram again and again.

The third visit came on 29th July from Seth Anandram Jaipuriya, Lucknow. 35 students from std 11-12 were came by bus and spent around 4 hours at Sopan Ashram, the visit was very useful and very much interactive.





## Science Shows at different places

Shiksha Sopan science cell gave the science shows at different places. These science shows are very useful to enhance the attention towards the subject, process of thinking for the subject, it is also very enjoyable and academic.

### **Workshops in Varanasi**

workshops Science cell gave two under supervision of Dr. H. C. Verma at Banaras, one for schools students and another for teachers. The workshops were conducted by Bharti Bhawan publication. On 18<sup>th</sup> July, more than 300 students of std 11-12 of Sant Atulanand Convent School, Varanasi attended the workshop. First, Verma sir gave a speech to them and after that Mr. Amit Kumar Bajpai, Mr. Ranjit and Mr. Yogesh gave the wonderful eye caching Science Show to them, they calculated speed of sound during the science show with very low-cost items. At the last question-answer session was conducted, students asked many questions related to Physics to verma sir, and many questions were came to verma sir's academic life.

On 19<sup>th</sup> July the workshop was conducted for teachers, around 150 teachers were assembled in a hall to listen Verma sir. Shiksha Sopan science team gave a science show of around one hour to them.







### **Workshops in Kanpur**

One session was conducted on 24<sup>th</sup> July at BNSD Shiksha Niketan, Kanpur for std 6-8 students, Around 400 students participated in it. The excitement of the students was high and they wanted to do every activity by their own hands. The session started with lighting the lamp in front of Maa Saraswati and Mr. Brajmohan Kumar Singh, Principal, welcomed Shiksha Sopan team in his college. The session was so inspiring and highly energetic.

Another session was conducted at Gaurav Memorial school students for classes 8-10, Mrs. Shobha, the principal, was so happy after seeing the session. She expressed her gratitude and wants more sessions for students.







## **Amar Ujala Printing Press Visit**

Shiksha Sopan visited Amar Ujala Printing Press, Dadanagar, Kanpur on 13<sup>th</sup> July with all the senior students of from each center.
