StUdent's Research Experimental Exposure LAb (SUREELA)

Mr. Rishabh Gupta has arranged equipments at SUREELA for distillation and the separation of two or more non-miscible liquids using a separating funnel. Current endeavors include the distillation-based separation of two or more miscible liquids with distinct boiling points, such as extracting water from an ethanol mixture. The team is concurrently involved in column chromatography studies.



It is useful to purify the mixture of compounds. Separating funnel is useful to separate two or more non-miscible liquids which have different densities.

Five M.Sc. Physics students from CSJM University, Kanpur, have recently become members of this laboratory. A specialized dissertation course has been crafted for their academic pursuits. They will be here for a year, focusing on various research projects. Before the commencement of the dissertation, a concise pre-dissertation course has been devised to acquaint students with the operational procedures and handling of instruments within the SUREELA Lab.

Sopan Anaupacharik Shikshan Kendra (SASK)

Uniform Distribution Program

Special Session

A 2-hour special session on pollution was organized for SAEC's children by the IEEE team of IIT Kanpur. The session covered various aspects of pollution, from small-scale issues to larger environmental concerns. Ms. Ankita Kumari spoke about water pollution, Ms. Alka Dileep discussed air pollution, Ms. Prachi focused on Waste Management, Mr. Prakriti Azad addressed Invasive Alien Species, and Mr. Sudep Bhattacharya shared insights on EM wave pollution. The session was highly informative and beneficial for the students, offering a detailed understanding of the diverse challenges posed by different types of pollution.



Home Visit

On the auspicious occasion of Diwali, a visit to the residences of the students was meticulously planned. IITK student volunteers, alongside Center Coordinator Vinay Mishra Ji, undertook the visit to convey Diwali wishes to both the students and their family members.

Television Day

On World Television Day, observed from the 21st to the 23rd of November, SAEC conducted a formal celebration. An essay competition was held, prompting children to write on the topic: "What do you know about the useful software or apps used in computers, television, laptops." Concurrently, an informational session enlightened the children about newspapers, covering the color code employed in newspaper printing—C (cyan), M (magenta), Y (yellow), and K (black).



Craft Classes

In conjunction with their regular classes, children have actively participated in craft sessions starting from November 27. These classes, held once a week, are dedicated to crafting decorative models using waste materials. Our upcoming endeavors aim to enhance these models, and the finalized creations will be distributed among Shiksha Sopan's valued well-wishers.

Sopan Library Shloka Path

On October 2, 17 children from class 1st to 5th participated in the "Shloka Path" competition. Library members provided training on expressive shloka recitation. The children, accompanied by their parents, showed great enthusiasm throughout the program.



In the program, Amit Ji and Vimal Ji, serving as judges, offered encouragement to the participating children. The event concluded with the announcement of first, second, and third-place winners, and prizes were distributed among them.

Sanskaar Shala

These sessions, led by library members under the supervision of Mrs. Pushapa Tripathi, the library coordinator, take place in a designated room within the Type One Community Center at IIT Kanpur.
