Our activities done in the month of January by our different centers are briefly described here.

## Science Workshop in Gyandayani Open Air Lab

As we have mentioned in January Newsletter, Gyandayani Open Air Lab (GOAL) is functional and we have plans to conduct varieties of activities in GOAL. Shiksha Sopan conducted two consecutive Physical Science workshops in the month of January here. The first workshop was held from 6th January to 11th January 2021. This workshop was specially organized for class 10<sup>th</sup> students. Ten students of Sopan Ashram Evening Center participated in this workshop.



This workshop was based on measurements. We showed variety of measuring instruments to the students and explained how the least count can be calculated, how can we measure the thickness of wire by screw gauge and vernier calipers. Students used these instruments and had a first hand experience of such measurements. They want to continue these type of experimental classes. Ms. Neha Katiyar conducted the sessions.

The second workshop was specially organized for recipient scholars of Dr V. N. Kulkarni Merit Scholarship. This workshop was held from 22nd January to 25th January. A total 18 students participated in this workshop, these students were from class 8<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup>. The motive of this workshop was to give them practical exposure. This workshop was fully based on eye-chaching science experiments. Mr. Amit Kumar Bajpai, Mr. Yogesh Kumar Jha, Miss Neha Katiyar, Mr. Vijay Kushwaha, and Mr. Vinay Kumar Mishra gave the sessions in the workshop.

# Omkareshwar Saraswati Vidya Niketan Inter College Visit

As the Covid situation was getting normal in Kanpur, Shiksha Sopan re-started the Visit program of DOSTI project. In this, we invite schools to send students to Sopan Ashram for 3-4 hours to experience the joy of learning in the lap of Nature. A total of 105 students from Omkareshwar School visited Sopan Ashram in three groups on 19<sup>th</sup> , 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> January. Each day 35 students came in school bus together with their teachers. Each day, the very first session was taken by Dr. H C Verma motivating the students and then science/Maths session through experiments and activities happened.

Students were very happy to interact with Verma sir as well as with the volunteers of Shiksha Sopan. A famous educationist of Kanpur Mr. Angad Singh also visited and met Dr H C Verma sir. Mrs. Anju Awasthi, Manager and Mr. Ram Milan, Principal were also there. These three days also gave lots of energy to us and we are ready for upcoming events.







## Republic day program and Dr VNK Scholarship distribution
