Dear Readers, Greeting from the Shiksha Sopan family. After a long wait, we are in somewhat better situation to meet each other physically. Various centers of Shiksha Sopan started the programe in offline mode with proper social distancing and masks. This has indeed given us a moral boost. In October month, several activities were planned and performed. We would like to share our experiences and work details with you.

Central programs

First Sunday Club (FSC)

First Sunday Club is the joint venture of SGM-IAPT Anveshika and Shiksha Sopan. Its meeting is held on every First Sunday of the month at Sopan Ashram. In this activity, Physics teachers from different schools/colleges of Kanpur and nearby districts come at Sopan Ashram to discuss physics. In the FSC meeting on 3rd October, Dr. H. C. Verma introduced simple pendulum to the audience present. He oscillated a pendulum in front of the audience and it started changing its plane of oscillation. Now the time was for thinking why the plane changed. All the members of the group realized that simple pendulum is not so simple. He introduced sand pendulum, naughty pendulum, long pendulum and coupled pendulum. Apart from the pendulum, teachers also asked questions from other fields of Physics. As usual, Dr. Verma gave several ideas on teaching skills, communication style during the classroom teaching, which is very fruitful for teachers.





Three-day camp at Sopan Ashram

A three-day residential camp was organized from 8th to 10th October at Sopan Ashram for selected 10 teachers from various parts of the country. This workshop had various sessions like experiments, activities, discussion, technical sessions, talks and formal open house sessions. Some teacher participants were from Govt. schools of Kanpur district who attended the sessions from 9.30Am to 5.30 Pm., Other participants were provided accommodation itself at Sopan Ashram. Mr. Satish Tiwari, District Inspector of School (DIOS), Kanpur, had very kindly deputed them to attend the workshop.

Mrs. Smita Fangariya, Head of Department of Physics, Amity International School, Noida was the resource person of the workshop. The main attraction of this session was Physics through the kitchen which is taken by Mrs Smita Fangariya. Prof. H. C. Verma gave a session of the mathematics aspects of same functions useful for Physics teachers. This was a really wonderful and one of the most attractive sessions. Prof. Sameer Khandekar gave a technical session on thermodynamics of Air Conditions (AC). After giving the theoretical and background, he opened an AC in front of the participants and how the lawas of thermodynamics leads to a useful product like AC. The session was greatly appreciated by one and all.

Mr. Yogesh K Jha, Mr. Amit K Bajpai, Mr. Ranjit and Ms. Neha gave an experimental demonstration session during the workshop.

We invited a reputed Ophthalmologist (Eye specialist) of Kanpur, Dr. Shekhar Rastogi for a session on functioning of eyes and common diseases. The participants teachers asked questions and Dr. Rastogi replied all these in details. We gained many information which are important for eyes. He very specifically advised for minimum use of mobile phones for readings. The other advise was not having long sessions on computers. Dr. Rastogi and his wife Dr.Vibha Rastogi were happy to see the Sopan Ashram and kinds of facilities for Science Education.





Sopan Ashram Visit by KIT Students

Kanpur Institute of Technology (KIT), B.Tech ist year students from all branches and their faculty members visited Sopan Ashram in two groups on 18th and 19th October, 2021.
