Six months down the lockdown declared, Shiksha Sopan volunteers wanted to do some thing more vibrant, more motivating, more constructive together with the ongoing digital classes for various whatsapp groups. A physical meeting of the center in charges and other senior volunteers was conducted at Sopan Ashram on 3rd September. Full care was taken regarding COVID-19 by having proper face mask, hand sanitizer, and social distancing. It was very satisfying for all to see each other, talk to each other and discuss ideas to do something different to enthuse the children and volunteers together.

Two major programs were decided to work on. One was a Google meet class to upgrade language skills of the volunteers and the other was to conduct a fancy dress competition among the children associated with different centers of Shiksha Sopan. Talks are on for a resource person who can joyfully improve the Hindi that we use to speak and write. The course is likely to start in October. The process to conduct the fancy dress competition has already started in the month of September.

Fancy Dress

All the center coordinators were given the responsibility to enroll the students for the competition. According to the norms decided, each participant has to choose a character; it can be a historic figure, or a National hero or a typical profession-based or any other character. He/ she has to dress up accordingly, appear on the stage and speak some dialogues. Participants were asked to make a video of the performance and send it to the center coordinator through Whatsapp for screening. The process for the screening has been completed in the month of September. The next round is also started and the process is going on.

Financial Assistance for Higher Education

Shiksha Sopan has a program to provide financial assistance to students associated with Shiksha Sopan for many years, going for education beyond std 12th and whose economic background of the family is weak.

Three such cases were considered and approved by Shiksha Sopan in the month of September Two of these are from Barasirohi Evening Center and one from Sopan Ashram Evening Center. Ms. Deepika Srivastava and Ms Priyanka Srivastava of BEC were given assistance applied for B.Sc. and BA programs respectively.

Ms. Avni Sharma is a very bright student of Sopan Ashram Evening Center and passed her 12th this year. I am very sure that you had read about her in August 2020 newsletter. She got selected in NIFT Bhopal. She was also given financial assistance by Shiksha Sopan.

Shri Ganesh Prasad Verma Uccha Shiksha Prakalp

Shiksha Sopan has decided to expand the scope of financial assistance for Higher Education both in terms of geographical reach and kind of courses opted. A new project in the name of Shri Ganesh Prasad Verma Uccha Shiksha Prakalp has been initiated and all applications in this regard will be considered under this project. Dr. Devi Prasad Verma, Retired professor of Mathematics at Patna University has been instrumental to initiate this project in memory of his father Shri Ganesh Prasad Verma.

Shiksha Sopan has constituted a 3- member committee headed by Dr Arun Kumar Sharma, Professor, IIT Kanpur who is also an Executive Committee member of Shiksha Sopan, to work out the detailed norms and decide upon the applications received.

Sopan Anaupcharik Shikshan Kendra (SASK)

The brave and supportive volunteers of SASK visited the center regularly for making the teaching modules for students, so that they can teach students through digital networking without any glitch.
